I. 45 BC - Julius Caesar becomes the first dictator of Rome. This signals the end of the Roman Republic.



II. 27 BC - The Roman Empire begins as Caesar Augustus becomes the first Roman Emperor.



III. 61AD-Boudicca leads the Iceni in a revolt against the Romans.



IV. 121 AD - The Hadrian Wall is built. To keep out the barbarians a long wall is built across northern England.



V. 410 AD- Honorius withdraws Romans from Britain.
