1941 - Battle of Keren (British beat Italians) British forces occupied Eritrea	1950 - Britain gave Eritrea to Emperor Haile Selassie (leader of Ethiopia)	1961 - A small group of Eritreans launched the war for independence.	1961- War for independence began (lasted 30 years)	1993 - Eritrea formally secedes from Ethiopia after a referendum.	1998 - Full-scale war evolves, due to border ownership of Badme. More than 70,000 Ethiopian citizens of Eritrean origin are expelled from Ethiopia.	2000 - A peace agreement is signed - with both sides agreeing to accept an arbitration ruling.	2018 - Ethiopia elected Abi Ahmed as Prime Minister (ended conflict).
